**SUBJECT** 

Adopt Resolution 22-28 Proclaiming A Local Emergency, Re-ratifying the Proclamation of a State of Emergency Issued on March 04, 2020, by Governor Gavin Newsom, and Re-authorizing Remote Teleconference Meetings of the Legislative Bodies of the Santa Clara Valley Open Space Authority for the Period March 10 Through April 8, 2022, Pursuant to Brown Act Provisions

## **REVENUE/COST**

## **BACKGROUND**

On February 10, 2022, the Board approved Resolution 22-20 proclaiming a local emergency, ratifying the proclamation of a State of Emergency issued on March 04, 2020 by Governor Gavin Newsom and authorizing remote teleconference meetings for 30 days, through March 12, 2022. Among other things, AB 361 allowed legislative bodies to continue to hold remote meetings during the pandemic. More explicitly, this legislation allowed local agencies to use teleconferencing without having to comply with the standard requirements of the Brown Act, provided that there is a "proclaimed state of emergency," as there is currently in the Governor's State of Emergency Declaration, issued on March 04, 2020, the state of emergency has not been lifted, and the legislative body meets "other requirements", including, the legislative body shall, every thirty (30) days thereafter, make the same findings by majority vote.

## **DISCUSSION**

Several of the features of operating Board and Committee meetings under AB 361 during the COVID-19 pandemic, as opposed to under the current Brown Act law, allow the Board and its committees to continue to conduct meetings in a safe meeting environment while allowing greater public participation in the legislative process and access to meetings.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff is recommending that the Board consider adopting Resolution 22-28, which re-authorizes the Board and Board Committees to continue to meet remotely for 30 days in accordance with requirements outlined in the Resolution, through April 8, 2022.
